Responsibilities

- · Attend internal Elders Circle Team meetings.
- Connect with local youth and community organizations.
- Organize and facilitate youth-led interviews with seniors to prepare and disseminate Elder profiles from local Elders who are 'unsung heroes'.
- Support the outreach and organization of Canada-wide, on-line sessions with Indigenous and Western Elders.
- Support outreach and partnerships with other regional and national Elder programs in coordinating a national day of events and activities (October 1, 2024) for Elders across BC to express our deep concerns about the climate crisis.
- Provide technical support for all online meetings and educational/networking sessions.
- Support SPEC's Communications Coordinator to plan marketing and promotional materials.
- Report progress and results on a regular basis.
- Collect and manage program outreach and other data.

Requirements

- A desire to meet and honour Elders
- Willingness to learn about the age-related experience, wisdom, skills, and knowledge of Elders
- Interviewing skills and ability to guide youth interviewers

- Excellent English language communication skills (oral and written)
- Experience with program design and event planning
- Strong time management and organization skills, with attention to detail
- Proficient in Microsoft Office and Google workspace
- Experience with Mailchimp
- Experience with diverse backgrounds, learning styles, and language abilities
- Passion for change-making through community-based programming

The position is remote and requires semi-regular travel to Vancouver.

Eligibility

Candidates must meet Canada Summer Jobs Program eligibility criteria:

- Be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of employment
- Be a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act
- Be legally entitled to work according to British Columbia legislation and regulations

International students are not eligible. Recent immigrants are eligible if they are Canadian Citizens or permanent residents.
